NEWS FROM LTC

Lakeshore Technical College is quietly making a positive impact in the village, offering educational opportunities and helping residents and students grow.

LTC is represented in the community, by its high school liaison dedicated to serving the school district. Liaison Sara Greenwood visits the high school monthly and makes presentations on college and careers when requested.

In addition to liaison visits, LTC is providing a Nursing Assistant course at the high school this spring for students in Mishicot and elsewhere throughout the county. Students enrolled in Medical Terminology at the high school are earning college credit through LTC. By taking this course in high school they are saving money and getting a jumpstart on their college careers.

LTC also is a sponsor of Project Mini-Chopper, which pairs local industries with area high school student teams. The teams build a mini-chopper which reflects the design of their sponsor's product. Students learn a variety of skills through the program while building the chopper. They also receive advanced standing credit through LTC. This year Mishicot High Schools students are paired with Formrite.

LTC's involvement in Mishicot isn't only for high school students. LTC also offers community education classes in the fall and spring open to all residents communitywide. Evening classes are held at Mishicot High School.

Mishicot Youth Sports Baseball and Softball Tournaments_

The Mishicot Youth Sports organization will be hosting its 6th annual baseball and softball tournaments from June 23-26, 2011 at the Mishicot Village Park and the Mishicot Vet's Club diamonds. Parents, coaches, willing volunteers, and even the youth all help to plan, organize, and set-up for the weekend, especially the concessions and the baseball/softball fields.

This year, there will be four different leagues competing for championships, including Peanuts T-ball, PeeWees baseball, Modified Girls' softball, and new in 2011, Ponies baseball. Games will be played Thursday and Friday nights, along with all day Saturday and Sunday. The finals in each of the leagues will take place later on Sunday.

Teams from throughout Manitowoc County will be coming to Mishicot, to take part in the tournament. In past years, teams from such communities as Francis Creek, Newton, Valders, St. Nazianz, and Reedsville have competed against our own teams from Mishicot, giving local fans an opportunity to see teams from other divisions.

Besides the on-field competition, the tournament brings many fans to the Mishicot area, which is great for the local economy. Additionally, the money raised from the tournaments goes right back into the community, providing the Village Park and Vet's Club with new scoreboards, new bleachers, new bases, and new sports equipment used by the Mishicot baseball and softball teams.

The teams competing for championships on Sunday can earn individual medals, as well as team trophies. More importantly, the tournament atmosphere provides a unique setting for the various teams to showcase their talents, and because of the timing of the games (late June), also gives teams a chance to gauge where there are in terms of their season. But above all, the tournaments provide a unique opportunity for family members and friends to come out during a weekend and cheer on their son or daughter, neighbor or friend, as they try and help their baseball or softball team play as well as they can.
