➤ The Mishicot Senior Club is always welcoming new members to join in the fun. Dues are \$2 for those 60 years and older. The club meets at 1 p.m. at the VFW, 314 W. Main Street, twice a month on the second and fourth Wednesdays. A short business meeting is conducted followed by a speaker on topics of interest to seniors. The Club hosts two potluck lunches, two dine-out lunches, and a once-a -year county Senior Banquet. Cards are played afterwards. There is an ongoing game of Sheephead on Mondays with cash prizes. Blood pressure is checked every six weeks by county health nurse Nancy Cohen—this service is available even if you are not a member of the Senior Club. ➤ Mishicot's Senior Nutrition Center is located at the VFW, 314 W. Main Street. Meals are served every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at the center or delivered to your residence. The meal program is for all seniors regardless of race, sex, national origin, or handicap. Participation is not related to income. The suggested donation for those sixty and older is \$3.50. No one is denied a meal based on ability to pay. Reservations and cancellations are required 24 hours in advance by calling 920-683-4180 or toll free 1-877-416-7083. The site is closed when school is closed, so listen to radio stations WOMT (1240 AM), WCUB (980 AM, 92.1 FM), WLKN (98.1 FM), WBAY (TV-2), WFRV (TV-5), WLUK (TV-11), and WGBA (TV-26) for updates.

#### **Pink Heals**

The Mishicot Ambulance and Fire Department have joined forces to bring the Pink Heals program to Manitowoc County. It is a nationally recognized movement that helps raise money for women and children who are currently battling cancer. Fire fighters donate their time and talents, driving Pink Fire Trucks across America in celebration of women in the country. The Pink Fire trucks are named after women or children who are battling or have lost their fight with cancer. The fire trucks are signed by anyone who has been touched by cancer. The color Pink represents women not a disease! The money raised stays in Manitowoc County. Pink Heals consists of volunteers so 100% of the profits go back to the community. The "Direct Care Assistance Program" is funded by the sale of merchandise at events. How we help: by paying a bill that the recipient may not have the money to pay; by paying utility bills or part of the remainder of a hospital bill, after insurance has paid. If there is a greater need, fund raiser or food or clothing drives may be organized. Pink Heals members sold merchandise and provided information at the summer concerts this summer. The group sells t-shirts, sweatshirts and wrist bands to raise funds. All Mishicot area residents are encouraged to wear the color pink for the Village celebration of "Cares Enough to Wear Pink" days on October 25, 26, and 27. #### **School News**

This year, the School District of Mishicot was awarded a Carol M. White Physical Education Program (PEP) grant for the *Whole Child - Whole Year - Whole Life* project. PEP is a highly-competitive federally-funded grant program aimed at reducing childhood and adolescent obesity by initiating, expanding, or enhancing physical education programs to help students meet state standards. Projects promoting lifelong physical activity and healthy eating are particularly encouraged.

We anticipate receiving three years of grant funding for *Whole Child - Whole Year - Whole Life*, which began this August 1 and will end July 31, 2015. During this time, we will be able to: revise and expand our PE curriculum to include a wider range of physical activities and technologies for objective assessment of physical activity levels and fitness progress; implement activity programming and install a ropes course and climbing wall at each school; and collaborate with several valuable community partners to increase opportunities for students to be active and learn about healthy eating choices. These are just a few of the many benefits this grant will bring to our school and community. In order to maintain and continue to receive grant funding under the program, we are required to assess and report the progress of the three outcomes listed below, as well as project-specific outcomes.

- Measure One: The percentage of students who engage in 60 minutes of daily physical activity. Grantees must use pedometers for students in grades K-12 and an additional 3-Day Physical Activity Recall (3DPAR) instrument to collect data on students in grades 5-12.
- Measure Two: The percentage of students who achieve age-appropriate cardiovascular fitness levels. Grantees are required to use the PACER test to assess cardiovascular fitness in all students.
- Measure Three: The percentage of students served by the grant who consumed fruit two or more times per day and vegetables three or more times per day. Programs serving high school students are required to use the nutrition-related questions from the Youth Risk Behavior Survey to determine the number of students who meet these goals. Grantees must select their own tool for measuring this outcome for elementary and middle school students.

We are excited about the new activities and services we will be able to offer our students through this grant. Our final annual government report will be due at the end of August 2013. District performance results of our project will be available for parent and community review in early 2014 via the district website.
