Chief of Police Resigns

Mishicot Police Chief, Ryan Gilbert, resigned his position in September to begin a new opportunity. Chief Gilbert began his career in Mishicot in 1998 as a part-time officer, then became full-time in 2000. Gilbert was promoted to Chief of Police in 2002.

Gilbert worked in our community in many ways. Together with local teens, enough money was raised to build the Mishicot Skate Park in 2004. In 2010, a four-year agreement was reached between Mishicot and Two Rivers creating the Two Rivers/Mishicot Municipal Court. The Municipal Court for the City of Two Rivers and Village of Mishicot was established to serve the citizens of their communities and to alleviate the problem of the high caseload in the Circuit Court system. The court is self-sustaining as the fines and almost all the court costs remains with the Village/City. The rest of the money assessed on the fines is paid to Manitowoc County and the State to support the Crime Lab, Jail, OWI education, and Domestic Violence programs.

Gilbert wrote and partnered with other locales for numerous grants. His efforts provided over \$200,000 in money and equipment for the Mishicot Police and Fire Departments, Ambulance Service, and School District. Some of the equipment purchased with these funds include a new defibrillator, four-wheeler and rescue trailer and raft, speed display board, night vision equipment, and a "Secure our Schools" partnership grant with the school district.

Gilbert attended many training session to better serve our village in his capacity of Chief. He attended several WMD and Incident and Command and Response courses throughout the U.S. Other specialized training includes NICB Vehicle Theft and Recovery, School Crisis Preparedness, A Child Is Missing, and more. Gilbert was selected to attend the 251st session of the FBI National Academy. This is an elite training session where on one-tenth of 1% of law enforcement personnel are able to attend.

In 2013, Gilbert received his Bachelors of Science degree in Business Management and is looking forward to earning his Masters Degree in the future. Mishicot wishes the best to Ryan Gilbert as he moves on to the next stage in his career.

Mishicot Area Ambulance Service is looking for people interested in being EMTs or drivers. The Mishicot Area Ambulance Service is a volunteer force. Members are paid hourly for being on-call, responding to calls, and training. Schooling is paid for by the ambulance service when you complete the training and commit to a year of service to the village department. Ambulance service members must live in the Village of Mishicot or the Towns of Gibson, Mishicot, Two Creeks, Two Rivers, or the northeast half of the Town of Kossuth. Home Delivered Meals and Dining for Senior Citizens_____

Manitowoc County offers a wonderful service to eligible individuals that many may not be aware of-- a delicious, hot, home-delivered meal. Home Delivered Meals are available anywhere in the County. In Mishicot and its surrounding areas, meals can be delivered up to five days a week. Eligibility guidelines are as follows:

- A person aged 60 years of age or older who is frail and essentially homebound (does not leave home under normal circumstances, flexibility is allowed for appointments), or a spouse of an eligible person regardless of age or condition.
- A disabled individual who resides at home with an eligible older individual participating in the program.

A dining site is also located at the Mishicot Vets Club where meals are served Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays to anyone 60 years of age or older and their spouse regardless of age. Meals are available to all qualifying individuals on a donation basis regardless of income.
