

# **Pumpkinfest Contest Rules**October 18, 2014



# **Pumpkin Baking Contest:**

Entries must contain **pumpkin** as an ingredient with the exception of decorated cakes/cookies All entries must be edible

No entry requiring electricity or heating is allowed

Include an index card with your name & phone number on one side & recipe on the other

Entries must be brought to the Mishicot village hall between 9 and 10 AM

Entries may be picked up after 2 PM

# Pumpkin Carving & Decorating:

Pumpkins must be carved OR decorated in a seasonal fall theme

If pumpkin cut in any manner it will be classified as carved

Pumpkins must be registered at the Mishicot Fire Station between 9 and 10 AM

Include an index card with your name, grade in school, phone number, and address

Pumpkins will be judged according to division by age

Age-appropriate entries determined at judges' discretion

Decisions of the judges are final

Pumpkin entries may be picked up after 2 PM




### **Mishicot Post Office**

# Mishicot Ambulance Service\_\_\_\_\_

Mishicot Area Ambulance Service is looking for people interested in being EMTs or drivers. The Mishicot Area Ambulance Service is a volunteer force. Members are paid hourly for being on-call, responding to calls, and training. Schooling is paid for by the ambulance service when you complete the training and commit to a year of service to the village department. Ambulance service members must live in the Village of Mishicot or the Towns of Gibson, Mishicot, Two Creeks, Two Rivers, or the northeast half of the Town of Kossuth. Historic Mishicot Homes—Mishicot Poor House Contributed by Jim Sustman

In 1870, the town of Mishicot (the village was not incorporated until 1950) voted to erect a house for the poor and aged who could no longer care for themselves. This house was located on top of the hill on the corner of Oak and Randolph Streets. Maps of the village from 1870 to 1921 label this location as the "Poor House" which is visible in early photos of the village. Henry



Levenhagen, Ira Smith (son of the founder of the village), and Fred Drews were some of the people who helped in its construction. Ellen Cayo, Frank Baugniet, and John Borguald, listed in the Town Treasure Report, were a few of the "superintendents" caregivers. Frank Baugniet was responsible for the care of a Mrs. Mishicott and upon her death in the late 1880's had a coffin made for her at the price of \$17 paid to Bruno Mueller—the village undertaker. The last occupants of the house were members of the Andrew Ciglar family. Anyone who has information about the Mishicot Poor House is invited to share it with the Mishicot Historical Museum by contacting Jim Sustman at 920-755-3317. The Mishicot Historical Museum is open weekends from 1 to 4 p.m. until Pumpkinfest on October 18<sup>th</sup> for those interested in more information on the history of the Mishicot area.

# Pink Heals Manitowoc County

It is that time of year again. Fall is in the air. Mishicot has many events going on again this fall for you to enjoy. Please come out and support your community.

We've been busy at Pink Heals this past year. Since our "Pink" fire truck, Colton was dedicated in May he has been invited to about 35 events in Manitowoc County and the surrounding area. He has numerous stories with signatures written all over him. He is a moving memorial for people who have been touched by cancer.

As of last week, we have helped 40+ people in Manitowoc County who were battling cancer. That is over \$20,000 in medical bills (after insurance has paid), house or rent payments and utility bills paid for those who need it most. The only way that was possible is because of generous people like you and our volunteers. None of us are paid, so you know your donations go back to those in need and stay right here in Manitowoc County.

We have received a donation from the Ant Hill Mob. We were chosen as one of the charities from the "Bike Show" last spring. On Saturday of the County Fair, they presented "Pink Heals" with a check for \$15,000. What a wonderful blessing for our group. A big THANK YOU to the Ant Hill Mob. This helps us to help more people here in the county.

We are hoping to raise more money in October. "Cares Enough to Wear Pink" day is October 25<sup>th</sup> at Fox Hills Resort in Mishicot. Let's turn Manitowoc County "Pink" that day. Starting with our parade at 11:30 a.m., lineup at Mishicot High School at 10:30 a.m., we have fire trucks and other emergency vehicles. New this year is that you can enter a float done in pink or dedicated to any kind of cancer, a float in honor or memory of people with cancer. Use your imagination; just let us know about your entry. The parade will end at Fox Hills and more fun is to be had. There will be fire fighter relays right after the parade, vendors and raffles. The "Cruising the Course" 5K walk/run is again being done right on the golf course. Registration starts at 3 p.m. and the walk/run at 4 p.m. The Strawberry Jam Band will be playing from 7 – 11p.m., with live auction during band breaks.

Come out to Mishicot, wear your pink or buy a shirt at the event. Please help us to help those who are fighting the fight for their lives. See you there!
