- ✓ All entries must be edible
- ✓ No entry requiring electricity or heating is allowed
- \checkmark Include an index card with your name & phone number on one side and the recipe on the other
- ✓ Entries must be brought to the Mishicot Village Hall between 9-10am
- ✓ Entries may be picked up after 2pm
- ✓ Entries will be judged on overall appearance, presentation, originality and taste at the discretion of the judges

Division 1: Decorated Cupcakes / Cookies Division 3: Pumpkin flavored pies

Division 5: Pumpkin flavored bread / muffins

Division 2: Decorated Cakes Division 4: Pumpkin flavored bars / cookies Division 6: Other

- ✓ Pumpkins must be carved OR decorated in a seasonal fall theme
- ✓ If pumpkin is cut in any manner it will be classified as carved
- ✓ Pumpkins must be registered at the Mishicot Fire Station between 8:30-9:30am
- ✓ Include an index card with your name, grade in school, phone number and address
- ✓ Pumpkins will be judged according to division by age
- ✓ Age appropriate entries determined at judges' discretion
- ✓ Decisions of the judges are final
- ✓ Pumpkin Entries may be picked up after 2pm

- ✓ Bring pumpkins to the Mishicot Country Store between 9am- 11am to be weighed in
- ✓ Judging begins at approximately 1pm

Historic Mishicot Homes

Historic Mishicot Homes 5th installment (*Contributed by Jim Sustman*) 238-242 South Main Street

In the 1890s' a number of new large Victorian style houses were being built in Mishicot, and elsewhere. In an earlier column we had mentioned the Holst house (current site of the Mishicot Village Hall) and Dr Karnopps' house at 113 Elizabeth St. The house pictured is another example and still stands at 238-242 S. Main Street. today. It was built in 1895 by Attorney Adolph and Mrs. Anna Tesarik Choloupek who were moving to Mishicot from Francis Creek to start his law practice. Adoph came from the family that was responsible for the saw



mill and later a brewery in Francis Creek. The photo above shows their five children, Victor, Edwin, Olga, Blanche, and Lillian. The parents are on the front porch. There was a small farm that was included with the house.

Unfortunately, Att. Adolph died suddenly of TB in 1905. His wife Anna and the children continued to live in the house until 1930. In recent years, the house has had a number of changes made to it and most recently was turned into three apartments.

One of the Choloupek children, Lillian, eventually became famous throughout the state as an educator and was responsible for improving the quality of education in the rural one-room schools in the county. In 1920 she became the first and only woman to be Manitowoc County's Superintendent of Schools. (*Interestingly, the first Manitowoc County Superintendent of Schools for the county in 1858 was B.J. Van Velkenberg , son-in-law of Daniel Smith, founder of our village.*) A number of books have been written on outstanding northeastern Wisconsin women and Lillian is included in them. She married George Schmidt Sr. in 1926 and together they had one son, George Schmidt Jr., whom many of us knew and remember. Lillian died in 1960.
