Pumpkinfest Contest Rules October 15, 2016

Pumpkin Baking & Decorating Contest:

- ✓ All Entries must contain <u>pumpkin</u> as an ingredient with the exception of the decorated cakes and cookies
- ✓ All entries must be edible
- \checkmark No entry requiring electricity or heating is allowed
- \checkmark Include an index card with your name & phone number on one side and the recipe on the other
- ✓ Entries must be brought to the Mishicot Village Hall between 9-10am
- ✓ Entries may be picked up after 2pm
- ✓ Entries will be judged on overall appearance, presentation, originality and taste at the discretion of the judges

Divisions include:

Division 1: Decorated Cupcakes / Cookies Division 3: Pumpkin flavored pies Division 5: Pumpkin flavored bread / muffins Division 2: Decorated Cakes Division 4: Pumpkin flavored bars / cookies Division 6: Other

Pumpkin Carving & Decorating

- ✓ Pumpkins must be carved OR decorated in a seasonal fall theme
- \checkmark If pumpkin is cut in any manner it will be classified as carved
- ✓ Pumpkins must be registered at the Mishicot Fire Station between 8:30-9:30am
- \checkmark Include an index card with your name, grade in school, phone number and address
- \checkmark Pumpkins will be judged according to division by age
- ✓ Age appropriate entries determined at judges' discretion
- \checkmark Decisions of the judges are final
- ✓ Pumpkin Entries may be picked up after 2pm

Giant Pumpkin Weigh-In

- ✓ Bring pumpkins to the Mishicot Country Store between 9am-11am weighed in
- ✓ Judging begins at approximately 1pm

Election News from the Mishicot Village Clerk's Office

General Election Day is Tuesday, November 8! Many of you are already thinking about the important choices you are about to make. For those of you who live in the Village of Mishicot, ballots have already arrived in my office. In person/in office absentee voting will begin on Monday, October 24 and will continue through November 4; however, if you need a ballot before October 24, one may now be mailed to you.

Here is a listing of dates and deadlines that may be important to you:

Wednesday, October 19	Last Day to Register to Vote By Mail
Monday, October 24	First Day to Vote Absentee In the Clerk's Office
Thursday, November 3	Last Day to Request an Absentee Ballot by Mail
Friday, November 4	Last day to Absentee Vote In the Clerk's Office
Friday, November 4	Last day to Register to Vote in the Clerk's Office
Tuesday, November 8	Fall General Election

Important points to remember:

If registering to vote, be sure to provide Proof of Residence. Without it, your registration will be returned to you.

If voting in person (either in office or at the polls) or by absentee, be sure to provide a Photo ID.
