Pumpkin Baking & Decorating Contest:

- ✓ All Entries must contain <u>pumpkin</u> as an ingredient with the exception of the decorated cakes and cookies
- ✓ All entries must be edible
- ✓ No entry requiring electricity or heating is allowed
- \checkmark Include an index card with your name & phone number on one side and the recipe on the other
- ✓ Entries must be brought to the Old School in Mishicot located at 315 Elizabeth Street between 9-10 am
- ✓ Entries may be picked up after 2:00 pm
- ✓ Entries will be judged on overall appearance, presentation, originality and taste at the discretion of the judges

- \checkmark Pumpkins will be judged according to division and by age
- ✓ Age appropriate entries determined at judges' discretion
- ✓ Decisions of the judges are final
- ✓ Pumpkin Entries may be picked up after 2 pm

Giant Pumpkin Weigh-In:

- ✓ Bring pumpkins to the Mishicot Country Store between 9am-11am
- ✓ Judging begins at approximately 1pm

Mishicot Nature Center

The Mishicot Nature Center is now open for all students in the Mishicot School District. The Old School building/Nature Center, located on the M.E.C.C.A. Trail behind O.H. Schultz Elementary, was transformed this summer, into a hands-on, fun, learning environment for students, by Becky Armbruster (Middle School Science) and Jamie Propson (Agriculture). Their goal was to bring the love of science, and the appreciation of nature, to all students within the district. Their passion led them to collaborate with local businesses, leaders, and organizations, such as the Fish and Wildlife Service, the Manitowoc Trappers Association, Jambo Creek Sportsman's Club, Maribel Sportsman's Club, FFA Alumni and many other generous supporters of environmental education.

While in the nature center, a few things that can be seen are fur displays of forest animals, deer hides, fish mounts, several antler mounts, turkey fans, a microscope station for students to explore soil, feathers, and leaves, several totes filled with lesson plans for teachers, a nature art station, and a sensory station for students, so they can be hands-on with materials, such as turtle shells, bones, antlers, feathers, pine cones,

rocks, a raccoon tail and so much more. The students that have already been to the center have loved the outdoor experience as well as the opportunity to learn science in a different way. The center is not complete, so the teachers are still accepting any donations of furs, fish or bird mounts, small game mounts, consumable art supplies, or even books.
