35th Annual Pumpkinfest – October 21, 2023

- ❖ **Pumpkinfest Parade** – Starts at noon (12:00 pm) October 21, 2023 and lines up at the O.H. Schultz Elementary School, 510 Woodlawn in Mishicot. Anyone who would like to participate in the parade, please show up between 11:15am and 11:30am to get lined up. The Parade Marshall will get everyone in place and he will be there by 11:15 am. (No calls please -- just show up) Parade route starts at O.H. Schultz Elementary School, down Washington Street to East Main Street, then West to Randolph Street, and then back to the O.H. Schultz Elementary School.
- ❖ **Village and Parade ordinance:** Per Village Ordinance, **NO** throwing candy or whatever from vehicles. As of June 22, 2006, ATV's will ***not*** be used in the Mishicot parades unless pulling a float unit or is owned, operated, or authorized by the Mishicot Village Board and Police Department. ATV's can be placed on a trailer and displayed in that manner to promote the various ATV clubs. Any unauthorized ATVs on village streets or public property will be issued the appropriate citations. - ✓ Include an index card with your name & phone number on one side and the recipe on the other
- ✓ Entries must be brought to the Old School in Mishicot located at 315 Elizabeth Street between 9 and 10 am
- ✓ Winners will be posted and announced around 1 pm
- ✓ Entries may be picked up after 2:00 pm
- ✓ Entries will be judged on overall appearance, presentation, originality and taste at the discretion of the judges

- ✓ If pumpkin is cut in any manner, it will be classified as carved
- ✓ Pumpkins must be registered at the Mishicot Fire Station between 8:30am-9:30am on October 21st
- ✓ Include an index card with your name, grade in school, phone number and address
- ✓ Pumpkins will be judged according to division and by age
- ✓ Age – appropriate entries determined at judges' discretion
- ✓ Decisions of the judges are final
- ✓ Winners will be posted and announced around 11am
- ✓ Pumpkin Entries may be picked up after 2 pm

Giant Pumpkin Weigh-In:

- ✓ Bring pumpkins to the Mishicot Country Store between 9am-11am; Weigh-in starts after the Parade
- ✓ Judging begins at approximately 1pm.

Home Delivered Meals Seniors

(Contributed by Kim Loose, Nutrition Program Coordinator; Aging & Disability Resource Center of the Lakeshore)

Manitowoc County offers a wonderful service to eligible individuals that many may not be aware of, a delicious, hot, home delivered meal. Home Delivered Meals are available anywhere in the County. In Mishicot and its surrounding areas, meals can be delivered up to 5 days a week. Eligibility guidelines are as follows:

- A person aged 60 years of age or older who is frail and essentially homebound (does not leave home under normal circumstances, flexibility is allowed for appointments), or a spouse of an eligible person regardless of age or condition.
- A disabled individual, under the age of 60, who resides at home with an eligible older individual participating in the program.
- Meals are available to all qualifying individuals on a donation basis, regardless of income or ability to contribute.

MEALS ON WHEELS/ADRC OF THE LAKESHORE

The ADRC of the Lakeshore is reaching out with an exciting opportunity to serve your community. Many of you know that the ADRC of the Lakeshore supports the elderly and homebound through Meals-On-Wheels in our community. The Meals-On-Wheels serves Mishicot and the surrounding areas 5 days a week solely through the help of incredible volunteers. As our population continues to age, the need becomes greater and the demand for volunteers increases. Currently, our volunteer needs have drastically changed given the COVID-19 pandemic. That's where you come in! They are looking to partner with businesses for 2-3 hours a month to help us maintain our services in the Mishicot area. We need 2 people *just once a month* – or more if you are interested – to deliver meals to the homebound. We have opportunities available 5 days a week but the greatest need exists on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 10:15 am – 12:15 pm. If you're concerned about social distancing and precautionary measures, please rest assured that we have developed a great system which ensures the safety of both you and the participant.

As an invested partner, there is a short application form to fill out for those who would like to volunteer and a brief background check. After that, we move on to a quick training and send you out for your first deliveries! If it sounds simple, it really is! We only ask that you refrain from soliciting of your business. Feel free to wear clothing that represents your business and share photos of yourself delivering meals to promote your community involvement but to maintain confidentiality we ask that we never include a participant in those photos.

Elections – There are no more elections this year.

New Credit Card Processor – The Village will be implementing a new credit card processor in the near future. A flyer will be sent out with the 3rd quarter utility bills explaining what you need to do if you pay your utility bills through our current processor, PSN. It is estimated that the new card processor will go live towards the end of the year. We will post a notice on our website and Facebook page when that happens.

Building Permits – Before you start that home improvement project, be sure to contact Village Hall to see if you need a building permit. Building permits are required for most projects, including fences. If your project is an exterior project, please submit a site plan with your lot line measurements for your project or your permit could be delayed. Also, remember to call for an inspection when your project is complete. For questions on what to include in your site plan, contact the Village Hall at (920) 755-2525.
