Mishicot's Yesteryear_

This is the first of a series on Mishicot homes written by Jim Sustman.

Office and home of Justice of Peace Isaac Craite (1858-1918) at 435 Elizabeth Street. The house was built in the late 1880's by Isaac Craite. Isaac served Mishicot as a Justice of Peace and town clerk from 1880 - 1884 out of his combined small home and office on Elizabeth Street. It is the only mansard roof home in the village—a typical French style roof. Craite was born in the town of Manitowoc Rapids in 1858; the second oldest of ten children of Euseb Craite and Zoe Ruell Craite. At age 13, in 1871, the family moved to Mishicot and operated a farm in the area of east Willow Street. Isaac had a strong ambition for education, attending Mishicot common school and later Oshkosh Normal to become a teacher. He taught a number of years at Pleasant View School in the town of Mishicot and while teaching also became town clerk and Justice of the Peace. He served in that capacity until his election as the first municipal judge If Manitowoc County in 1891. Isaac was self-taught in law and passed his bar exam earlier that year. He and his wife, the former Adeline Fortier, moved to 1129 S. Seventh Street in Manitowoc. They had no children. In 1918, he suffered a stroke at a function at the Manitowoc Hotel. He died at his home a few days later where a huge funeral was held. He is buried in Evergreen Cemetery next to his wife who died some 23 years later. His parents and a number of his siblings are buried here in the Holy Cross cemetery.

Garden Remedies

Spring is time to get those gardens going. How about planting some herbs? Aside from using herbs for their culinary uses, there are some very common herbs that can remedy certain physical illness. I like to tell my clients these come from "God's Pharmacy." Here are some suggestions:

- ➤ Try <u>Basil</u> as it will cool down a fever, especially when used as a tea. It also helps nausea and indigestion.
- ➤ <u>Dill</u> will help with colic, heartburn, and/or gas. The word dill comes from the Old Norse word *dilla*, meaning to lull or soothe. Just chew it or make a tea of it.
- ➤ Deflate with <u>Parsley</u>. Diuretic herbs such as parsley prevent problems such as kidney stones and bladder infections. They keep the body's plumbing running smoothly. They also relieve bloating during menstruation. And there is a reason it is on the edge of your dinner plate, it is an effective breath freshener because it contains high levels of chlorophyll.



- ➤ <u>Sage</u> is effective for symptoms of menopause like hot flashes and night sweats because of its estrogenic action and because it has tannins that can dry up perspiration. Dash it in food, or try it as a tea, making it as strong as needed to relieve symptoms.
- Rosemary helps keep blood vessels dilated and so help with headaches. Sip as a tea. Rosemary is also historically known for remembrance.
- > Turn to <u>Thyme</u> if your sinus secretions are not clear or white, you need a warming, drying herb. Thyme is a traditional remedy for respiratory infections and is strongly antiseptic. Drink as a tea for sinus pain and pressure.
- The genus Capsicum includes <u>red and green chili peppers</u>, <u>cayenne</u>, <u>paprika and bell peppers</u>. Cayenne normalizes the circulation and is very well suited for those who have high or low blood pressure. Taken as a daily tonic it is of benefit for the heart and circulation.

This is just the tip of the tip of the iceberg! There are so many other herbs to use for your health and even the ones I've mentioned do so much more as all of them are full of vitamins, enzymes and minerals which is exactly what our bodies run on! Plant these natural safe plants to get well and stay well!


