Mishicot Son Enshrined into the Lakeshore All Sports Hall of Fame



Congratulations to Peter Holmes. Pete was enshrined into the Lakeshore All Sports Hall of Fame at the 40th Annual Enshrinement Banquet held at the Holiday Inn, Manitowoc, on Wednesday, April 27. Pete has lived in Mishicot his entire life, graduating from Mishicot High School in 1968. He lettered in basketball and football three years and lettered twice in track, but his biggest sport accomplishments were in basketball. When Pete was in high school, the three-point shot was not yet part of the game. In spite of that fact, Pete scored nearly 30 points in a game in 1968 and set the school record for single-game scoring with 49 points. He held the career scoring record at Mishicot from 1968 to 2004 with 1,277 points. Pete continued to be very active in sports after high school and throughout his adult life. We congratulate Pete and thank him for making Mishicot proud.

Mishicot Lion's Club News

The Mishicot Lion's Club continues to make important contributions to the Mishicot area. Here is just a snapshot of their latest accomplishments:

- ❖ The Mishicot Lion's Club once again conducted vision screening for the Mishicot School District. A new process was used called spot vision screening, which incorporates the use of a camera. The camera improves the ability to find vision problems and speeds up the screening process. The screening was done by Fred Gebhart. Fred is the 2nd Vice District Governor for Lion's District 27-B1 and is from the Stockbridge Lion's Club. Mr. Gebhart was assisted by school nurse, Terri Shebesta.
- ❖ Mishicot Lion's Club awards two scholarships to Mishicot High School seniors. The 2015 scholarship winners were Kaitlyn Schetter and Maria Endries.
- ❖ The Mishicot Lion's also sponsors a Badger Boy and Badger Girl. These individuals present their experiences learning about government and networking with other young leaders in the state. The 2016 representatives are Zach Fencl and Emily Mowrer.
- The Mishicot Lions have also performed many tasks that both beautify and improve life in Mishicot. Among them are caring for the flower bed at the intersection of Washington Street and E. Main Street, including the maintenance and setup of the nativity scene; posting new historical signs around the village with funds from both MAGIC and the Mishicot Lion's; construction and maintenance of six Little Libraries around the village; and coordinating the Christmas Toy Drive.

Village News

Are you registered to vote?

With the April 5 election behind us and summer fast approaching, it is easy to think that the fall elections are far off into the future. However, the Fall Primary is Tuesday, August 9, not all that far away and will be here before you know it. If you are not currently registered to vote, you can avoid many Election Day registration headaches by registering in the clerk's office ahead of time. Come on down to the village office. Gail and I are here and ready to assist you. You may register if you will be 18 years of age before the next election and will have lived at your current residence at least 28 days before the next election. Bring with you proof of residency. The most common types of proof of residency used are a Wisconsin Driver's License, Wisconsin-issued government ID, a utility bill, or a bank statement with your current address on it. If you need to register and do not have any of these items available to you with your current information, please contact my office for assistance BEFORE the election, particularly if you are a student or you are an apartment resident who may not readily have what you need to register. The clerk can often assist you with proof of residency, provided advance notice is given.

Have you received a voter registration form in the mail?

I have also begun to receive calls from residents asking about voter registration forms which have come to them in the mail. They appear to have come from my office because they contain the return address of the village hall and may even include my name. Often these forms are partially filled out and contain incorrect information. They may be sent to someone who is already correctly registered; and, unfortunately, they are occasionally mailed to someone who is deceased. These mailings come from voter participation groups who do not always have accurate information and are reaching out to voters in a busy election year. If you have any questions or concerns about these forms, please do not hesitate to call my office. If you decide to use a registration form like this and wish to return it to my office by mail, please be sure to include a copy of your proof of residence. If I receive a registration form in the mail or in our drop box without the required proof of residence, under state law I will have no choice but to return the form to you with a letter requesting proper proof of residence.

Free Epi-Pen Training At Main Street Coffee Haus & Bistro

On July 1, 2015 Governor Scott Walker signed into law that businesses may now have Epi-Pens in their establishment. Restaurants, day cares, sports clubs, campgrounds, gas stations and more have the choice to be prepared in the event of an emergency. The law states that an employee/representative of that business needs to have training on how to recognize signs and symptoms of a severe allergic reaction known as anaphylaxis, on the storage of the Epi-Pen, and what to do after it is administered.

This training will be offered FREE of charge at Main Street Coffee Haus & Bistro at 447 E. Main Street Mishicot on Thursday, May 12th at 6PM. The instructor of the class will be David Murack, Assistant Chief of the Two Rivers Fire Dept.

Sign up is required by calling 920-973-5558 to ensure adequate materials. The deadline for sign up is Monday May 9^{th} at 4PM.

This training is FREE and open to the public and is strongly encouraged to help increase the safety of our community.

It was just 19 months ago that a beloved member of our community died of a bee sting. Dillon Mueller's family is working tirelessly to get the word out that businesses can now have an Epi-Pen.

T- Shirts will be sold for \$10 with proceeds going directly back to the businesses to help with the purchase of Epi-Pens. Donations will be accepted.

Prescriptions for Epi-Pens will be available for organizations and businesses upon completion of the course.



Historic Mishicot Homes

Historic Mishicot Homes 7th installment (*Contributed by Jim Sustman*) 314 Jackson St. The Nicholas H. and Coretta Scheuer House

This large, stately house was built in 1906 by Matt Zima for Nicholas H. and Coretta Thompson Scheuer, at a cost of \$6,000. It follows the design of a number of other large Victorian Style Homes in the village. Members of the Scheuer family continued to live in the house until around 1990, when Johanna Pelishek purchased the house and turned it into a Bread and Breakfast. Around 1995, Attorney Robert Paul and his wife, Annette, purchased the house and continue to live there today. In addition to the house, a large barn, located where the former grocery store still stands next to the Village Hall, was also



built by Mr. Zima. The barn was primarily used to house cattle that were later slaughtered for Scheuer's Meat Market.

In his earlier years, Nic Scheuer was the business manager of Mishicot Brewing Company. Later, he opened a meat market on Main Street that continued in business for three generations of the Scheuer family. In 1922, a new building was constructed at 432 E. Main Street, to house the meat market. This new building was also built by Matt Zima. After Nic Scheuer's death in 1951, his son, Earl, operated the Meat Market and lived in the upper level of the building. Later Earl's son, Robert, took over the market and continued in business there until 1984. The River's Edge Gallery, owned and operated by Chris Baugniet, occupies that building today.
