34th Annual Pumpkinfest – October 15, 2022

Pumpkinfest Parade – Starts at noon (12:00 pm) October 15, 2022 and lines up at the O.H. Schultz Elementary School, 510 Woodlawn in Mishicot. Anyone who would like to participate in the parade, please show up between 11:00am and 11:30am to get lined up. The Parade Marshall will get everyone in place and he will be there by 11:00 am. (No calls please -- just show up) Parade route starts at O.H. Schultz Elementary School, down Washington Street to East Main Street, then West to Randolph Street, and then back to the O.H. Schultz Elementary School. **Again this year, we will have a contest for best entry in the parade.**

Village and Parade ordinance: Per Village Ordinance, **NO** throwing candy or whatever from vehicles. Home Delivered Meals Seniors

Manitowoc County offers a wonderful service to eligible individuals that many may not be aware of, a delicious, hot, home delivered meal. Home Delivered Meals are available anywhere in the County. In Mishicot and its surrounding areas, meals can be delivered up to 5 days a week. Eligibility guidelines are as follows:

- A person aged 60 years of age or older who is frail and essentially homebound (does not leave home under normal circumstances, flexibility is allowed for appointments), or a spouse of an eligible person regardless of age or condition.
- A disabled individual, under the age of 60, who resides at home with an eligible older individual participating in the program.
- Meals are available to all qualifying individuals on a donation basis, regardless of income or ability to contribute.

Why Buy Local?

We hear it all the time right? However, how often do we follow through on it? As a local business owner telling you to buy local I am guilty of not buying local all the time either. Whether its price, convenience, selection, or a bad experience there are many reasons why. What if we try a little harder? What does it even matter? Take a moment to read some statistics below. The data gives us some compelling reasons to at least consider a local option first.

- For every dollar you spend at a locally-owned business about **70 cents stays in the community**. Whereas less than 40 cents stays in the community when you buy at a big box store.* Worse yet, many online purchases return little to nothing to the local economy.
- What happens to the 70 cents? At Eis Implement, 86% of our staff resides in Manitowoc County, many of them right here in the Mishicot area. The bulk of their wages stay local to pay for goods, services, property taxes, etc. In addition, their savings accounts provide funding for community banks to issue a larger amount of loans putting that money back into the local economy. This creates a flywheel affect where the 70 cents keeps getting reinvested. 70+70+70+70 adds up to a lot more than 40+40+40+40 or 5+5+5+5.
- Locally-owned businesses **give three times as much** to local charities, schools and programs compared to corporate chains.* It's not all about money either. Elections – There are two more elections this year. The next one will be held on Tuesday, August 9, 2022—Fall Partisan Primary. Polls will be open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm. Elections are held in the VFW building at 314 W Main St, Mishicot, WI. Check out www.myvote.wi.us to register to vote, request an absentee ballot, update your name or address and check out your voter information. If you use MyVote to register, you must do so at least 20 days prior to the election. If you need to register after the 20-day mark, you can do so by stopping at the Village Hall at 511 E Main Street, right next to Dollar General. **Please bring proof of residence and a photo ID to register.** Office hours are Monday, Wednesday and Thursday 9 am to 4:30 pm and Tuesday and Fridays 9 am – noon. If you received a letter from the village regarding your voter registration status, please be sure to respond to the letter so that we can have accurate information on your voting status.

Comprehensive Plan Update – The village is in the process of updating its comprehensive plan and all residents will have the opportunity to participate in a community survey regarding what this plan should entail for the future of Mishicot. Please see the next page in this newsletter for more information. The online community survey will go live on June 20, 2022.

Building Permits – Before you start that home improvement project, be sure to contact Village Hall to see if you need a building permit. Building permits are required for most projects, including fences. If your project is an exterior project, please submit a site plan with your lot line measurements for your project or your permit could be delayed. For questions on what to include in your site plan, contact the Village Hall at (920) 755-2525.

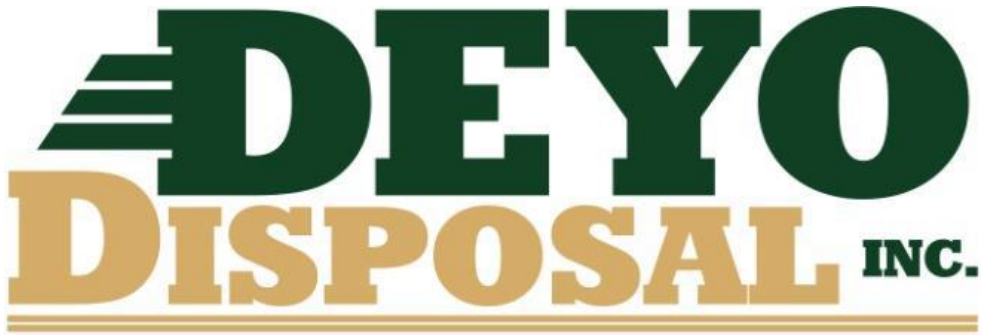
