TO DEPOSIT YOUR MEDICATIONS INTO THE DRUG DROP BOX:

NO SHARPS (NEEDLES, BLADES) NO THERMOMETERS NO PILL BOTTLES OR BOXES

- Please empty your medications into a clear zip-lock type baggie
- Make sure the baggie is properly sealed
- Place baggie with medications in the slot on top of the DRUG DROP BOX
- Please take home and properly dispose or recycle your containers it is always good practice to remove any labels on the containers before you discard/recycle them.

THANK YOU FOR CHOOSING TO DISCARD YOUR MEDICATIONS RESPONSIBLY

This box is emptied daily and the contents are taken off-site!

The box will be accessible during the hours that the village hall is open.

REAL ESTATE TAXES. The first installment of your real estate taxes must be paid on or before January 31, 2024. The second half must be received by the Manitowoc County Treasurer on or before July 31, 2024 to avoid interest. The lottery credit for 2023 only applies to property that you own that was used as your primary residence on January 1, 2023. If property you claim as your primary residence does not have a lottery credit on it and you qualify for it, please contact the Village Hall. You can pay your taxes by mail, in the drop box outside of the Village Hall or at the Village Hall during regular business hours. Make checks payable to the "Village of Mishicot". Please return the first payment stub along with your payment. **If you want a receipt, please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope along with your tax payment.**

PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES. Personal property taxes must be paid in full on or before January 31, 2024 to avoid accruing interest at the rate of 1% per month. This will be the last personal property tax bill you get. For 2024 and beyond, it will be exempt per the 2023 Wisconsin Act 12-Personal Property Exemption.

<u>DOG LICENSES – IMPORTANT NOTICE</u>. State law requires all dogs to be licensed annually. Proof of current rabies vaccination must be presented before a dog license will be issued. <u>Please bring in your rabies vaccination</u> even if you previously provided one as we have a new dog license program this year and will need it to update your dog's information. The license fee is \$5 for neutered/spayed dogs and \$10 for unneutered/unspayed dogs. There will be a \$25 late fee for all dogs not licensed by March 31, 2024. Owners can be fined for failure to license a dog annually.

<u>BUILDING PERMITS.</u> Before you start that home improvement project, be sure to contact the Village Hall to see if you need a building permit. **Building, electrical, HVAC, and plumbing permits are required for most projects, including fences.** If your project is an exterior project, please submit a site plan with your lot line measurements for your project or your permit could be delayed. For questions on what to include in your site plan, contact the Village Hall at (920) 755-2525.

MISHICOT MAINTENANCE-SNOW REMOVAL

Hello to all Village of Mishicot property owners. Many questions have come up regarding snow removal policies within the Village of Mishicot. The following is the village's ordinance concerning sidewalk snow removal:

<u>6.08 SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL. (1) FROM SIDEWALKS</u>. All village residents and property owners have 24 hours after the snowfall to remove snow and ice from their sidewalk; otherwise, the village will clear the sidewalk and send you an invoice. Failure to pay the invoice will result in it being applied to the tax roll as a special charge.

(2) DEPOSITS IN STREETS PROHIBITED. It is unlawful for any person in clearing snow from parking lots, driveways, filling stations, garages, retail stores, apartment buildings, or other areas to pile or distribute snow, or cause snow to be piled or distributed, in a street or alley in any manner that tends to narrow the traveled portion of the street, prevent parking at the curb, or in any other way impede snow removal or create a traffic hazard. Persons having an accumulation of snow that cannot be removed as set forth in the Section shall be responsible for its handling at their own expense without depositing same in the public streets or alleyways. (12-03-96). Also, remember that the village has a winter parking ban between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. during the months of December 1 through March 31.





The Mishicot Community Athletic Complex & Vinton Construction officially broke ground on November 6^{th} . We held a groundbreaking ceremony on November 9^{th} which is pictured above

The Mishicot Community Athletic Complex is seeking to acquire funds for an athletic complex in the Village of Mishicot. This will be self-funded by our organization and the Village of Mishicot. This investment will benefit hundreds of youth who will be provided with additional opportunities to participate in baseball and softball. The economic impact will be felt throughout Mishicot with the large amounts of people drawn to the area. The Mishicot Community Athletic Complex Committee has been active in creating a development plan for a complex that will provide the opportunity for over 200 youth, ages 6-18, to participate in baseball and softball. The complex will consist of four diamonds that will allow multiple games to be played simultaneously, with one of the diamonds being a regulation baseball field. There will also be a sizable concession stand with large bathrooms. The facility is handicap accessible to fit the needs of the large number of people attending the games, which will allow this facility to support multi team tournaments.

When complete, this project will serve softball and baseball teams throughout Northeastern Wisconsin, and far beyond. Because we have consistently experienced a great demand for additional tournament space, we will be able to attract more than enough teams for at least six tournaments every season with 50 or more teams per tournament. We anticipate that our new sports complex will serve teams from at least 33 surrounding communities. The Manitowoc Area Visitor's Bureau estimated that these tournaments would draw a

conservatively estimated 15,750 players, coaches, and their families to our community each season.


The Manitowoc Area Visitor & Convention Bureau's Economic Impact study for our project finds that the financial impact resulting from its successful completion will result in approximately \$640,695 inserted into our local economy every season, or \$106,782.50 per tournament hosted. This amount of revenue injected into our community each year would save the economy of Mishicot and pave our way to a successful and tourism-rich future.

The Mishicot Community Athletic Complex works through MAGIC (Mishicot Area Growth and Improvement Committee), which is a 501 (c)(3) whose mission is to promote economic growth in Mishicot and provide opportunities for youth and the community of Mishicot to thrive. This complex will not only expand our community, but aid in teaching our youth skills such as teamwork, collaboration, and time management.
